xplore some of the exciting possibilities and challenges of taking children outside in a one-day workshop hosted by Manitoba Education and the Manitoba Child Care Association.

This will be of special interest to Kindergarten and early childhood educators, school and childcare centre administrators, superintendents, and others interested in nature education.

Frances Krusekopf and Enid Elliot will share the development and implementation of a Nature Kindergarten in the Sooke BC School District where adults learn alongside the children and follow an inquiry-based, playful approach to education. Kindergarten children spend every morning outside in the forest learning, questioning, and wondering. This project has created a web of relationships among and between children, early childhood educators, teachers, and community members.

Enid Elliot, Ph.D., is an early childhood educator who continues to find herself surprised, intrigued, and delighted by children, families, and early childhood educators. As adjunct professor at University of Victoria and a faculty member at Camosun, Enid has been investigating the influence of outdoor natural settings on children and early childhood educators.
